Education

Tom received a Bachelor of Science in Math with a teaching certificate from Colorado State University in 1971. He received a Bachelor of Architecture, graduating on the Dean's List, with an emphasis in Structural Design from The University of Oregon in 1978.

Professional Experience

Tom has worked in Montana, Florida and Colorado for a number of different firms. He has had extensive experience in all phases of the architectural practice including marketing, programming, design, construction documents, bidding and construction administration. Because of his many working environments, he has had an opportunity to work on a wide variety of projects.

In Montana he worked on the world's tallest reinforced masonry building (the Sheraton Hotel), the largest Architectural Contract awarded by the State of Montana (Montana State Prison) and first Earth-Sheltered Elementary School in Billings (Harvest Elementary). The largest single concrete pour in Billings history was the raft footing system for a medical office building which was a nested group of hexagonal pods with compression ring – tension ring roof structures.

Before leaving Montana, Tom served as the Construction Coordinator for St Vincent's Hospital on their 23 million dollar expansion. He was on site full time as the owner's representative between the hospital and a design-build contracting company. One of his tasks was to organize a full-sized mock-up of an open-heart surgery suite.

In Florida, Tom designed a private school, a county jail and multiple bank additions.

After a brief hiatus' from Architecture, during which he was employed as a manufacturer's representative in the sporting goods industry, Tom worked with three different architectural firms in Colorado Springs: YOW, CSNA and Nakai & Associates. Projects from the Springs included Denver Women's Prison, Limon Correctional Facility, two police substations, a police DNA laboratory, four parking garages, three ground-up office buildings, several strip retail centers and a wide variety of tenant finish projects.
