In 1976, Larry Whittaker received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from Texas Tech University with a design emphasis in his studies. After three years of apprenticeship under such architects as John James Wallace and Walter E. Burgess, Larry was licensed to practice architecture in 1980. Upon completion of the requirements for the National Council of Registration Boards, he was certified in 1986 for the availability of reciprocity to practice architecture throughout the United States. This annual recertification process requires continuing education within the architectural field.
